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Introduction to the AHG Faith Award Program

Faith is foundational to the Mission of American Heritage Girls. Christ is the focus and the reason for everything AHG does. In the AHG Oath, girls promise to love God. In the AHG Creed, girls commit to being reverent. The AHG Program is rooted in Christ. Through the Faith Emphasis, AHG hopes that girls will grow in their faith and become lifelong Christ-followers. Girls will understand their identity in Christ, learn to submit to Christ, and seek God's will for their lives.

AHG hopes that girls will experience God in all parts of AHG—friends, service, badges, and more! AHG's Faith Award Program is one of the main avenues for integrating faith into the AHG Program.



TWO FAITH AWARD TRACKS

There are two tracks under which Faith Award options are available—The **Catholic Faith Awards** and the Build Your Faith Awards (**B.Y. Faith Awards**). The two tracks were created to allow families to choose the curriculum that best fits the needs of their girls. The Catholic Faith Awards honor the AHG Creed, Oath, and Mission, connecting what girls are learning in AHG with the Catechism of the Catholic Church. B.Y. Faith Awards allow families to choose from different options that will accelerate girls in learning to live by faith.

Both Faith Award tracks give girls the opportunity to grow deeper in their faith and relationship with Christ. Towards that end, one year of Faith Award programming is required for Tenderhearts, Explorers, and Pioneers to complete their Level Awards. For the Patriot Level Award, girls must complete either Segments One and Two of the Catholic Faith Award for their Program Level or one component of a B.Y. Faith Award.

CHOOSING A STUDY

AHG has compiled a diverse list of studies that meet the Faith Award requirements. Troops should include the input of their Charter Organization and the parents of each girl when choosing from these options:

| OPTION | DESCRIPTION |
|------------|--|
| Troop | Some of the approved studies are available to girls at every Program Level. Troops may decide to have all girls participate in the same study at their different Program Levels if parental input indicates that one study would meet the needs of all girls. Troops designate one person, often the Troop Shepherd, to lead the implementation. This role would include: helping girls choose the study, acquiring the materials, and equipping Unit Leaders to work with their Unit. |
| Unit | Troops may allow each Unit to choose a different study if parental input indicates that one study would meet the needs of all girls within that Unit. In this case, Unit Leaders and girls may choose from one of the options available for their Unit. |
| Individual | Though many Faith Awards are well-suited for completion in a group setting, girls may complete these awards independently with a trusted adult mentor, maintaining two-deep leadership, or a parent. As part of the Catholic Faith Award programming, Tenderhearts and Explorers working towards their Catholic Faith Awards will always complete their award with a parent. |

PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION

Troops are encouraged to choose an implementation strategy that best fits their Troop schedule and girls' needs. Recommended approaches, planning considerations, and sample schedules are provided for each Faith Award study in the following pages. As you create your implementation strategy, remember a girl must complete the Faith Award requirement(s) of her Program Level to earn her Level Award (see page 3).

| OPTION | DESCRIPTION |
|---------------------|---|
| Every Meeting | Work on Faith Awards during regular Unit time, progressing through a small portion of the requirements at each meeting throughout the Program Year. |
| Dedicated Meetings | Set aside a small number of meetings, either during your regular Troop meeting time or on a different date, to focus entirely on Faith Awards. |
| Faith-Focused Event | Pick a special day when girls can come together with their Unit to focus on their Faith Awards. Many of the approved studies may be completed in a one-day event or significant progress made with some follow-up work afterward. |
| Multi-Day Event | Take a Troop or Unit retreat weekend to work on Faith Awards, or incorporate them into a week-long camp with a workshop each day. Expand your event to Multi-Troop to provide additional perspectives during discussion time and increase girl connections. |
| Independent Study | Girls may work on their Faith Awards individually at home or in a small group setting outside of Troop time with a respected mentor, maintaining two-deep leadership, or with a parent. |

MULTIPLE CHRISTIAN FAITH TRADITIONS

Troops may encounter differing points of view among the girls through Faith Awards, particularly with membership from multiple faith traditions and backgrounds. This is an excellent opportunity for girls to learn to demonstrate respect toward each other. Troops serving girls from multiple faith traditions should assist girls and families in selecting a Faith Award that honors AHG's Christian values and what the family teaches at home. The faith tradition reflected in each study is labeled to help equip Troops in their decision-making.

| OPTION | DESCRIPTION |

| Catholic | These studies, created for AHG by the AHG National Catholic Committee, explore the faith, history, and traditions of the Catholic Church as they apply to the life of a Catholic AHG Girl Member. |
| Protestant | These studies are created by AHG Program Alliances for multiple organizations and explore the Protestant faith through studying Scripture and traditional faith disciplines. |
| Ecumenical | These studies are a mix of options created by both AHG and Program Alliances with content in line with core principles of the Christian faith, beliefs reflected in the AHG Statement of Faith. |

When implementing the Faith Award Program within a Troop of multiple faith traditions, studies that are specifically Catholic or Protestant may be completed at home or in a small group setting. Ecumenical Faith Awards may be completed at home, in a small group setting, or together as a whole Troop or Unit. It is essential to unite girls and adults under the Biblical truths found in the AHG Statement of Faith and learn from each other's perspectives on secondary issues. Adult Members should model respect and compassion to girls during these difficult conversations, and families can lean into the wisdom of their priest or pastor in both selecting curriculum and continuing in-depth discussions of deeper topics raised during girl studies.

TYPE OF STUDY

Each study option also has labels naming the type of study.

| OPTION | DESCRIPTION |

| Foundations | These studies are for girls learning about the building blocks of their faith. Foundations are fundamental to the faith of every Christian and may include topics such as the Gospel, prayer, how to read your Bible, who God is, etc. |
| Topical | These studies are for girls familiar with the basics who want to dive deeper into a particular topic. |
| In-depth | These studies are for girls who are more mature in their faith and want to dig into their relationship with the Lord. |

^{*} The above "Cost Per Girl" accounts for materials and insignia (prices subject to change). This reflects the estimated cost to purchase all materials and insignia required for just one girl:

- \$—free study materials, reflects cost of insignia only
- \$\$—low-cost study materials plus cost of insignia
- \$\$\$—higher-cost study materials plus cost of insignia

Some studies have a higher cost of materials for Patriots (i.e., Heart of Womanhood). Some studies have free or low-cost materials, but total spending increases with activity supplies (i.e., Pajamas and Pancakes Prayer Party for Girls in Prayer). Cost savings may result from studies that only require the purchase of materials once per Program Level (i.e., Bible Belles reading books). See Faith Award Descriptions on the following pages for detailed material and insignia breakdowns.

- ** The above "Approx. Time" represents an estimated amount of time taken to complete each award, as follows:
 - −Comparable to a light to average badge
 - (S) —Comparable to a slightly longer badge
 - ○○○—Comparable to two or more badges

Keep in mind that award requirements for Tenderhearts and Explorers will take less time than Pioneers and Patriots, as is the case with most badges. For example, the Girls in Prayer Patch Program will require more time for Pioneers and Patriots than for the younger Program Levels. This is comparable to the Daughter of the King Badge, which may be light compared to several other badges, but the Pioneers and Patriots will still require more time to complete the badge than younger Program Levels.

GUIDING GIRLS THROUGH THE AHG FAITH AWARD PROGRAM

Below are examples of how an American Heritage Girl could progress through the Faith Award Program by Level. See Faith Award Descriptions for a more in-depth explanation of each approved study option.

^{*} Through AHG's developmentally-phased programming, this study could be repeated at each Program Level by studying different Creed words at each level, completing a gradually higher level of requirements, and increasing the degree of study for each Creed word. SPIRIT OF THE BADGE

The AHG Program is designed to support a girl's Biblical worldview development with a strong focus on her relationship with Jesus Christ. Through the AHG Faith Award Program, faith-focused studies guide a girl through exploring and strengthening her relationship with her Heavenly Father. There are times when a specific Faith Award requirement can be fulfilled in a different way to best meet girls' needs. Troops are encouraged to reference AHG's **Spirit of the Badge** Principle when determining how to tailor the details of a Faith Award study for their Troop (keyword search "Spirit of the Badge" in **AHGresource**).

GOING BEYOND

Each approved Faith Award study option is rich in content designed to draw girls closer to their Lord and Savior. Troops are welcome and encouraged to utilize this material in ways over and above the Faith Award Program. For example, excerpts could be used for an opening devotional at a Troop meeting or a closing devotional before bed at a Unit lock-in. Older girl studies, such as **Live It Out: A Beautiful Tale of Integrity and Faith**, or spiritual foundation studies, such as **AHG Creed: A R.E.A.L. Life Bible Study**, can provide excellent time shared in God's Word by Adult Members during Troop Ministry Team meetings. Explore how these resources can best serve your Troop as Faith Awards and beyond!

FAITH AWARD PROGRAM TRAINING

Training is available on the **AHGequip** tab on AHGfamily. This training includes the **AHG Faith Award Program**—an overview of all Faith Awards—and the **Catholic Faith Award Mentor Training**. Training is accessible to any Adult Member who wants to learn more about AHG's Faith Award Program but is particularly recommended for Troop Shepherds or anyone working directly with girls pursuing their Faith Awards.

B.Y. Faith Awards

The Build Your Faith Award Program (B.Y. Faith Award Program) provides girls with a dynamic, exciting curriculum that helps them understand their identity in Christ and ignites a passion for pursuing His will in their lives. The name B.Y. Faith comes from Hebrews 11, which shows several examples of people throughout God's family who have taken steps in faith. By faith Abel brought, Noah built, Abraham obeyed, Isaac blessed, Joseph spoke, and so much more. God works through His people by guiding them to do things "by faith" rather than their own understanding. B.Y. is also an acronym for "Build Your." Before the girls in a Troop can do anything "by faith," they need to develop a love for and trust in God. Build her faith through AHG's Faith Award Program.

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The B.Y. Faith Award Program has several different options, created in collaboration with many of AHG's Program Alliances and volunteers to allow Troops, Units, and girls great choices at each Program Level. This program can be:

- **Used by multiple denominations**—Girls of most Christian denominations can participate and grow in their relationship and understanding of Christ by earning these awards.
- Customizable—Parents and Unit Leaders know their girls best. They know where girls
 need the most growth. With the guidance of their Charter Organization, Troop Shepherd,
 and parents, Unit Leaders should choose what will work best for their Unit from the
 approved awards on the following pages.
- Adaptable—Troops may adapt and utilize these options in many different AHG settings.

B.Y. FAITH AWARD INSIGNIA

When a girl completes one of the study options at her Program Level, she earns her Faith Award Pin. Each Program Level has a pin to wear on the front of her vest or sash. Tenderhearts and Explorers wear their pins under the Troop numbers on their vests. Pioneers and Patriots wear their pins under the Flag Patch on their sash. Girls can transfer these pins to each new uniform, stacked one on the other, in order to display the full collection. These pins can be purchased in the AHGstore by the Troop's Approved Purchasers.

Several studies also allow girls to earn a patch. These patches are placed on the back of a girl's vest or sash and would not move to the next uniform. Patches are optional, and some studies may not have corresponding patches. Patches can be purchased in the AHGstore by any parent or Adult Member.





AHG would like every girl to know how valuable and precious the Word of God is. When girls learn to engage directly with God's Word, they begin to know Him more deeply and desire to follow Him. The R.E.A.L Life Bible Study draws girls into Scripture to discover His truth for themselves with a four-step process that increases girls' understanding of Scripture and how it speaks into the words of the AHG Creed. As you lead girls through R.E.A.L. Life, AHG hopes that you too will grow in knowledge and love of God and the Holy Bible.

Read It—What does it say? Girls read one key Bible verse and up to ten "dig deeper" Scripture passages for each Creed word.

Examine It—What does it mean? Girls explore factual details of Scripture through questions and informational observations surrounding the Biblical passages, such as word definitions, authorship, and historical context.

Apply It—How does it affect me? Girls engage in critical thinking skills as they discuss the message within the studied Scripture, how it connects with other parts of the Bible, and what it means in their lives.

Live It—How can you use it to light your world? Girls deepen the connection between their life and their faith by putting legs to what they have learned through a large selection of activity options.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn the B.Y. Faith Award and R.E.A.L. Life Creed Study Patch, girls must complete the following requirements:

- Tenderhearts—four total verse studies plus two total activities (with focus on two Creed words)
- Explorers—six total verse studies plus three total activities (with focus on three Creed words)
- Pioneers—six total verse studies plus three total activities (with focus on three Creed words)
- Patriots—eight total verse studies plus four total activities (with focus on four Creed words)

The workbook includes verse study and notes pages for each key verse plus activity choices for each Creed word. The optional Extension Pack includes study pages for each "dig deeper" passage. This study is customizable and allows Troops to select the most appropriate verses (Read It), questions (Examine It and Apply It), and activities (Live It) for varying Program Levels and study settings.

TOTAL TIME

The total time required to complete this study depends upon Program Level, girl involvement in discussion, and how long they take to complete the activities. The following are estimates by Program Level:

Tenderhearts—2-4 hours
Explorers/Pioneers—3-5 hours
Patriots—4-6 hours

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Every Meeting

The Holy Scripture does not "return void" but accomplishes His desire and purpose in those who hear it (Isaiah 55:11). The objective of the R.E.A.L. Life Bible Study is to get girls and adults alike in the Word of God. Girls will learn how to use a Bible and Bible study resources, increase their comfort level in reading God's Word, apply critical thinking skills, and hear from God directly to better understand His will for their lives. Since these goals are best achieved with life habits formed through consistent repetition, AHG recommends implementing this study at every meeting. The first 15 minutes of each meeting could be dedicated to following the "Read It," "Examine It," and "Apply It" steps for a particular Scripture passage. The study is best conducted during Unit time due to differing depths of discussion and levels of requirements, but some portions may be completed as a whole Troop. Troops may wish to dedicate the beginning of each meeting to Bible study since the close of each meeting can often feel pressed for time. Closing each meeting with Bible study is also beneficial, leaving girls with food for thought until the next meeting. "Live It" activities may be completed during meeting time, alternating with verse study weeks, or girls may complete their "Live It" activities at home and bring completed projects back to their Unit Leader for review.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Dedicated Meetings

Whole meetings may be dedicated to completing this study. In this scenario, a full meeting would ideally be spent on one Creed word, covering two verse studies and a "Live It" activity. With this approach, Tenderhearts would need two dedicated meetings, Explorers and Pioneers three, and Patriots four.

Faith-Focused Event

This study may be the focus of a Troop or Unit event. Depending upon the length of the event, either a portion of the study may be completed together with girls finishing at home, or the entire study could be wrapped up in one day. Many of the "Live It" activities could be adapted as fun and meaningful ways to spend event time together. For whole Troop events, consider which activities could be conducted with multiple Program Levels combined and which should be completed as separate Units. For example, some verses lend themselves to more mature discussions with older girls, some "Live It" activities are more engaging for younger girls, etc.

Multi-Day Event

For week-long camps or other multi-day events, apply the same approach as dedicated meetings. Put aside at least one hour each day for Bible study and activities. Due to a different required number of Creed words for each Program Level, adjust your schedule to accommodate the Patriots (with four required Creed words), then use supplemental material to engage younger girls as needed during that same time. For example, at a four-day camp, Patriots could study a different word each day, Explorers and Pioneers could do the same with a "bonus" Creed word on the fourth day, and Tenderhearts could take two days per Creed word (one verse and one "Live It" each day).

Independent Study

If a girl participates in AHG's Trailblazer Program or the Troop has chosen to follow a different Faith Award study, a girl may complete this study independently. She may decide to do this study on her own, with her family, or with a group of other girls. Depending upon the girl's age, oversight for this study by a parent may be beneficial. The girl should present the completed study to her Unit Leader for review.

HOW TO PREPARE

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to order, download, and print the items listed under "Materials Purchase" above. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study (or are close to finishing) before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities.

Bible Translation

The Troop Board should decide which translation the Troop will follow for this study, whether it be the translations provided in the workbook, a single translation approved by the Charter Organization, or a mix of whichever translations each girl individually prefers. "Examine It" and "Apply It" questions have been tailored to the wording from the workbook translations but could be easily adapted as needed.

Selections

Choose which verses, questions, and activities to complete. Not all questions need to be answered—this would lengthen the completion time significantly. Conducting the study at the Unit Level (rather than as a whole Troop) facilitates a more age-appropriate selection of the "Examine It," "Apply It," and "Live It" steps.

Verse Display

Decide if you will write the verse on a large board or poster at the front of the room, if the girls will read the verse from their workbook, or both.

Bible Study Resources

Prepare a selection of Bible study resources, such as a Bible concordance, Bible dictionary, Bible encyclopedia, study Bible, interlinear Bible, etc. These resources may be available in print or digitally as a website or phone app. Not all resources need to be used for every verse study. Take the opportunity to gradually introduce girls to these resources, keeping age-appropriateness in mind. For example, Tenderhearts can grasp the concept of a dictionary, whereas Patriots could deepen their study with cross-references and interlinear text from Greek and Hebrew.

Guest Speakers

Several activities involve interviews with or presentations from guest speakers. Confirm who is available to meet with the girls, schedule the appropriate dates on their calendar and yours, and send a list of interview questions before the meeting date, if applicable. Follow up with guest speakers the week before your meeting to confirm they are still coming.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedules).

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations.

Written solely for AHG, this Patriot-only study offers girls the opportunity to understand and live God's story for their lives. The booklet encourages girls to determine what being a woman of integrity looks like through Bible studies, discussions, and activities. For Patriots working toward their Stars & Stripes Award, this study provides excellent moments of reflection and starter dough material for use in developing their Spiritual Walk Essay. Each girl is required to have a Girl Guide book. Adults leading the study will need an Adult Guide, which has all of the information included in the Girl Guide plus details on leading the study.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn this B.Y. Faith Award, girls must read *Live It Out: A Beautiful Tale of Integrity and Faith, Girl Guide* (80 pages), complete the activities (10 written reflections plus one final creative project), and discuss or journal responses to the questions found in each of the following eight sessions.

Part One: Understanding God's Story for Your Life

Session One: Surrendering to Christ

Session Two: Identity in Christ Session Three: Calling from Christ

Part Two: Living God's Story for Your Life

Session Four: Relationships in Christ Session Five: Your Story Through Christ

Session Six: Living in Christ

Session Seven: Developing Your Worldview Session Eight: A Life of Integrity in Christ

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Independent Study

Live It Out encourages girls to dig deeper into God's story for their lives. Each girl will learn what being a woman of integrity looks like for her life now and in the future. The material is designed for implementation in an independent or small group setting of 5-12 girls. Since the study is most effective when girls are interested in and responsive to the material, AHG recommends conducting the study with only one or a subset of girls who genuinely wish to pursue this outside regular meeting times. The study could be a senior activity for Patriots in their final year with AHG as they prepare to embark into the adult world. It is also an ideal study for one or more Stars & Stripes Award Candidates to walk through with their Stars & Stripes Mentor(s) to develop their Spiritual Walk Essay. Girls should retain their activity papers until the Final Project at the end of the study, which would also make a beautiful presentation at a Stars & Stripes Award Ceremony! Eight meetings (one per study session) could be held monthly in the hour preceding regular AHG meeting time, with a parent or second Adult Member present to provide two-deep leadership. Due to the reflective nature of the study, ideally, girls would have plenty of time to ponder the questions before offering a response, so see if they will commit to pre-reading and filling in workbook questions before discussing together.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Every Meeting

Girls may walk through a portion of the study in every meeting if the entire Unit has demonstrated buy-in and interest. AHG recommends breaking down larger Patriot Units into smaller groups for study time. Sessions and sections are inconsistent in length, so the amount of time spent on the study at each meeting may vary. Discussions may flow more smoothly and with more significant interaction if girls pre-read each section at home, writing answers in the workbook as they go. This pre-work would provide time for group discussion and activities at the meetings.

Dedicated Meetings

The Live It Out study could be completed during just a few dedicated meetings if expectations are set regarding the nature of those meetings. By dividing the book between four meetings, with two sessions per meeting, each meeting will be packed full, with one and a half to two hours of deep, reflective, soul-searching discussion. The same objectives may be accomplished in less, more productive time if girls prepare before the meetings by pre-reading and filling in answers to workbook questions.

Faith-Focused Event

Conducting this study as a one-day event would be intense but doable. Prepare for a long, eight to tenhour day to allow time for meals and breaks. Again, expectations should be set accordingly for the girls before committing to participation. Full ownership of the study goals is necessary for success. If you have sincere commitment and motivation from the girls going into the event, this study has the potential to be transformational and strengthen their foundation in Christ as they approach adulthood.

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings. Divide up the sessions and sections of the book to correspond with the available days. To give girls time to digest and reflect upon the material discussed, consider dividing study time into multiple daily gatherings. For instance, if the event is four days long, you might complete one session every morning and one session every afternoon, leaving room for meals and other activities.

HOW TO PREPARE

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to order the items listed under "Materials Purchase" above. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study (or are close to finishing) before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities.

Expectations

Prepare girls with realistic expectations, allowing them to ready their hearts and minds for the spiritual work ahead. Explain the purpose of the study and the value it will bring to their present and future walk with the Lord. Ensure that they are committed to full engagement in the discussions and activities.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedule).

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations.



God has given us a wonderful gift—His Word in the form of the Bible. As a girl earns this badge, she will learn more about the Bible, strengthening her knowledge and understanding of who God is, who she is, and how to seek His will. Due to variations in the canonization of Scripture, AHG recommends completing this badge independently or within a single faith tradition grouping.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn both the B.Y. Faith Award Pin and the accompanying badge, girls must complete the badge requirements as presented in either the *AHG Tenderheart & Explorer Handbook* or the *AHG Pioneer & Patriot Handbook*. Just as a girl may earn these badges at any and every Program Level, she may also complete them as her B.Y. Faith Award at any and every Program Level.

TOTAL TIME

The total time required to complete this study depends upon Program Level, girl involvement in discussion, and how long they take to complete the activities. The following are estimates by Program Level:

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Dedicated Meetings

For most Troops, a set number of meetings are put aside to complete a particular badge. Using this approach, Troops complete multiple badges, and girls focus on different Badge Frontiers at various times throughout the Program Year.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Every Meeting

While this badge does not have enough content to spread out to every meeting, there is an Explorer requirement that could extend throughout the Program Year. The Explorers are required to commit to heart and recite ten verses of their choosing. They may find it more meaningful (and easier) to complete all other badge requirements at the beginning of the year and then practice their verses together each week, ending the year with a meeting of recitation and celebration.

Faith-Focused Event

Most badge requirements could be completed in a one-day event (Explorers would need additional time in the weeks ahead to commit verses to heart). One approach might be for the Tenderhearts and Explorers to attend the event in the morning, complete their requirements, watch the Pioneers' and Patriots' parable presentation, and participate in the older girl-led service project. Everyone could enjoy lunch together, and the Tenderhearts and Explorers could go home while the Pioneers and Patriots continued with the remainder of their requirements in the afternoon.

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings, dividing requirements between the number of days in the event. Extra time after the event should be given to Explorers to practice their verses since it would likely be challenging to commit them to memory in just a few days.

The total time required to complete this study depends upon Program Level, which elective requirements are chosen, girl involvement in discussion, and how long they take to complete the activities. The following are estimates by Program Level:

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Dedicated Meetings

For most Troops, a set number of meetings are put aside to complete a particular badge. Using this approach, Troops complete multiple badges, and girls focus on different Badge Frontiers at various times throughout the Program Year.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Every Meeting

This badge could be divided to spread the requirements across more meetings than shown in the sample schedules below by alternating between story time and activities, enabling girls to engage in other activities in addition to badgework at each meeting.

Faith-Focused Event

All Women of Faith Badge requirements could be completed in a one-day event for the whole Troop. Girls could collectively listen to the story of one of the women listed, then break into Units for discussion and activities, returning to the group setting for the next story until all requirements have been completed.

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings, dividing requirements between the number of days in the event.

Independent Study

All badges in the AHG Girl Handbooks are available for girls to complete independently at home. Some coordination with the rest of the Troop or Unit may be necessary when girls are required to present or lead in a group setting.

HOW TO PREPARE

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to look up the Women of Faith Badge in the AHG Girl Handbooks. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study (or are close to finishing) before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities.

Requirements

Each badge has several mandatory and elective requirements in the AHG Girl Handbooks. Choose the electives that best fit the interests and needs of your Troop's girls. Review your final selection and the ideas found on AHG's Pinterest board to determine the details of your activity plans. Consider adding supplemental elements to increase the girls' engagement with the teaching material.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedules).

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations.

This study is available to Explorers, Pioneers, and Patriots and offers girls the opportunity to:

- Hear stories of children served by Back2Back Ministries,
- · Learn how belief systems and trauma impact orphaned and vulnerable children,
- Engage in time with God about His heart for the fatherless,
- · Serve children in the community or globally, and
- Be better prepared to serve orphaned and vulnerable children on a short-term mission trip.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn the B.Y. Faith Award and Back2Back Patch:

- 1. Explorers and Pioneers read *Tales of the Ones He Won't Let Go* (six chapters, 200 pages), and Patriots read *Relentless Hope* (15 chapters, 236 pages).
- 2. Each Program Level completes the following number of requirements.
 - Explorers—choose two of four available activities
 - Pioneers—choose three of seven available activities
 - Patriots—choose three of eight available activities
- 3. Pioneers and Patriots watch four Back2Back Ministry videos—Fear Brain (4:50), Trauma and the Brain (5:07), Indiscriminate Friendliness (2:56), and Creating Healthy Belief Systems (1:53).
- 4. All Program Levels complete the *I Am for You* Bible study guide (39 pages), reading all ten days and answering the study guide questions.

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Every Meeting

The author of Back2Back Ministries' books is an incredibly gifted storyteller—reading a chapter at each meeting will keep the girls engaged and eager to return for more. The challenge will be allotting enough time to read these books together. Tales of the Ones He Won't Let Go has longer chapters that will take close to 30 minutes to read, but there are only six chapters. Relentless Hope has slightly shorter chapters, but there are more of them. The sample schedules shown below include read-aloud time for both books. To save on meeting time, you may wish to have the girls read a chapter at home each week and conduct follow-up discussion time during meetings. The trade-off here is the need to buy a book for each girl. Know your girls and choose the best method for their needs, interests, and attention spans.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Dedicated Meetings

Since the bulk of this Patch Program involves reading, it may be challenging for girls to sit through listening to multiple chapters in one sitting. However, if the books are read at home, you may choose to have just two or three dedicated meetings to cover discussion of the reading material and the additional Patch Program activities.

Faith-Focused Event

As with dedicated meetings, it would be challenging for girls to sit through listening to an entire book at a one-day event. This option may be wiser for older girls who have already read the material at home.

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings, dividing up chapters and activities between the number of days in the event. For a camp setting, independent book reading might be ideal for girls to spend quiet time during the day, returning to the group setting for discussion. Patriots could complete their whole book in five days with a chapter each morning, afternoon, and evening.

Independent Study

The Back2Back Ministries Patch Program lends itself well to independent study at home. Due to the topics raised, AHG recommends that younger girls work through the program with a parent to discuss what they have read and learned. Older girls may fill in answers in the I Am for You Bible study and discuss with their Unit Leader when they have completed the Patch Program.

HOW TO PREPARE

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to order, download, and print the items listed under "Materials Purchase" above. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study (or are close to finishing) before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities.

Trauma

Read the book(s) and the study guide before deciding whether this series is a good fit for your Troop or Unit. If there are girls in your Troop who have experienced trauma in the form of neglect, abuse, foster care, or adoption, they may welcome hearing similar stories from others, OR they may find it painful to be reminded of these memories. Have a heartfelt, compassionate discussion with the parents of these girls to hear their wishes for their daughter. If there is a concern, ask if they would be willing to read the materials to help you decide. If parents are still wary after reading the book(s), consider choosing a different Faith Award study to pursue in a group setting.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedules).

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations. If you plan to stream the videos, confirm that you have working internet access in your meeting space.



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BIBLE BELLES PATCH PROGRAM

The Bible Belles Patch Program equips **Tenderhearts** and **Explorers** with strong character by connecting them to real heroes—women of Scripture—to help them discover the qualities that make a truly beautiful woman. In five colorfully illustrated and early reading level books, girls go on a journey with Rooney as she meets these extraordinary women. This study provides a simple and effective approach to developing a girl's inner beauty, strengthening her true identity, and guiding her towards her unique leadership role in God's kingdom.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn the B.Y. Faith Award and Bible Belles Patch:

- 1. Tenderhearts read two books (Books 1 and 2 recommended, 56 pages each) and complete each title's seven days of devotions and activities.
- 2. Explorers read three books (Books 3, 4, and 5 recommended, 56 pages each) and complete each title's seven days of devotions and activities.

TOTAL TIME

The total time required to complete this study depends upon Program Level, girl involvement in discussion, and how long they take to complete the activities. The following are estimates by Program Level:

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Every Meeting

The Bible Belles Patch Program is based on the Bible Belles book series. Volunteers will read the books aloud to the girls and then guide them through additional devotions, discussion time, and activities that reinforce the principles taught within the books. Since this series is geared toward younger girls with shorter attention spans, AHG recommends spreading the supplemental activities throughout a year's Troop meetings.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Dedicated Meetings

The Bible Belles Patch Program could also be completed within dedicated meeting time. The most straightforward approach might be to dedicate one full meeting per book (two for Tenderhearts and three for Explorers). Each meeting will require 1-1½hours to read the book and complete the Patch Program activities.

Faith-Focused Event

Conducting this study as a one-day event is doable but may push the boundaries of Tenderhearts' attention spans. Plan for at least four hours or more at your event to allow for breaks, snacks, etc. If Tenderhearts and Explorers are attending the same event, you might consider a read-aloud time in the beginning for all girls to hear all five stories and then divide the girls into their respective Units to complete the required activities. Even though it is suggested that Explorers complete books 3-5, all girls at a joint Tenderheart and Explorer event could instead read books one through three together, waiting to read each book until the previous book's activities are completed

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings by completing one book per day. Like a faith-focused event, Tenderhearts and Explorers could complete reading and activities from the same books together, if needed. Also, Tenderhearts are not limited to two books, and Explorers are not limited to three, so both age groups could complete all five books at a five-day event (still earning just one patch per girl).

Independent Study

This Patch Program may also be completed independently at home. Since Tenderhearts are early readers, AHG recommends they complete this with parent involvement, reading aloud the book and other portions as needed. While Explorers are more advanced readers and may complete this on their own, families may enjoy walking through the program together, incorporating HEARD: A Journal for Mothers and Daughters into their at-home studies

HOW TO PREPARE

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to order, download, and print the items listed under "Materials Purchase" above. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study (or are close to finishing) before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities.

Reading Voice

Read the stories beforehand to familiarize yourself with the story and practice reading aloud. Creating a few different character voices and sound effects can add to the girls' fun and engagement with the stories. Consider providing a leadership opportunity for older girls to present the read-aloud experience.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedules).

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations.

GIRLS IN PRAYER PATCH PROGRAM

The Girls in Prayer Patch Program, created by Moms in Prayer, introduces girls to many different aspects of prayer. Girls who participate in this study will enjoy hands-on prayer activities, learn Biblical truth about prayer, and grow closer to God and each other through the process of praying together. The Pajamas and Pancakes Prayer Party makes this an ideal patch program to walk through as a Troop overnight event. A girl may earn this B.Y. Faith Award at any and every Program Level.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn the B.Y. Faith Award and Girls in Prayer Patch:

- 1. All Program Levels hold a Pajamas and Pancakes (or Popcorn) Prayer Party as a Troop.
- 2. All Program Levels review the four steps of prayer using age-appropriate prayer guide cards, activities, and journaling.
- 3. Each Program Level completes the following number of requirements.
 - Tenderhearts—choose two of three available activities
 - Explorers—choose three of seven available activities
 - Pioneers and Patriots—choose five of nine available activities

TOTAL TIME

The total time required to complete this study depends upon Program Level, girl involvement in discussion, and how long they take to complete the activities. The following are estimates by Program Level:

Tenderhearts—3-4 hours

Explorers—3-5 hours

Pioneers/Patriots—4-6 hours

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Faith-Focused Event

The Girls in Prayer Patch Program was designed for implementation in an event setting of your choosing. The format works well in a lock-in or Saturday morning event, with a suggested "Pajamas and Pancakes (or Popcorn) Prayer Party" theme. The entire Patch Program may be completed at one event, or an abbreviated version of the four parts of prayer could be presented, followed by a pancake meal and completion of activities and prayer study booklets later during meetings or at home.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Every Meeting

This Patch Program may be divided into brief, 15-20 minute increments to present at each meeting. One approach might be starting with the introductory material at the first meeting, then alternating between teaching material and hands-on activities over the next few meetings (e.g., praise intro/activity/journal one week, Patch Program activity the next week, confession intro/activity/journal next, Patch Program activity after that, etc.). Sections of the prayer study booklet could be divided among the remaining meetings.

Dedicated Meetings

One approach to dedicating meetings to this Patch Program is to take four meetings and focus on one of the four parts of prayer at each. All prayer teaching material, Patch Program activities, and prayer study booklet sections that pertain to that part of prayer could be included in the focused meeting time together.

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings, dividing up Patch Program content based on the number of days in the event.

Independent Study

The Girls in Prayer Patch Program lends well to independent completion at home. AHG recommends that parents find a way to be actively involved, particularly for Tenderhearts and Explorers. The whole family could follow this study as an entire Saturday activity or a small portion over four weekends, enjoying a pancake meal together once finished.

HOW TO PREPARE

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to download and print the Girls in Prayer Patch Program documents linked under "Materials Purchase" above. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study (or are close to finishing) before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities

Event Planning

Walk through all your standard event planning steps as a Troop (e.g., budget, venue, health and safety, etc.). Decide if your event will be evening, morning, or overnight. Choose between a pancakes theme and meal or a popcorn theme, perhaps adding in a movie for an overnight lock-in.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedule).

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations. Each girl will need a blank prayer journal, printed and cut prayer cards, and printed and assembled prayer study booklets. Consider using a whiteboard to demonstrate the drawing activities for the girls.






HEART OF WOMANHOOD PATCH PROGRAM

Heart of Womanhood is a ministry that produces creative Bible studies to draw moms' and daughters' hearts closer to Jesus and each other. *The Heart of Womanhood PORTRAITS* series is a 31-lesson study through Proverbs 31 applicable for the **Explorer**, **Pioneer**, and **Patriot** Program Levels. The Bible study is divided into six separate booklets called "Frames" and includes activities titled "Projects," many of which involve arts and crafts. Whether you are a mom, grandmother, or Troop leader, the Heart of Womanhood ministry adds dimension and community to your spiritual connection with the younger generation entrusted to your care.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn the B.Y. Faith Award and Heart of Womanhood Patch and Arc:

- 1. Explorers, Pioneers, and Patriots read and discuss the Portrait Bible Study from each lesson in *Frame 1* (six lessons). Also, Patriots read and discuss the Portrait Bible Study from each lesson in *Frame 2* (five lessons). Each Portrait Bible Study takes approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.
- 2. Complete the following number of Projects. Each Project takes approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.
 - Explorers—complete two Projects from Frame 1
 - Pioneers—complete three Projects from Frame 1
 - Patriots—complete four total Projects from Frames 1 and 2
- 3. Complete the Personalized Heartwork for each lesson, which guides girls through about five minutes in Scripture each day of the week (six total weeks for Explorers and Pioneers and 11 total weeks for Patriots).

Girls may optionally complete additional studies from the series and earn an arc for each Frame.

TOTAL TIME

The total time required to complete this study depends upon Program Level, girl involvement in discussion, and how long they take to complete the activities. The following are estimates by Program Level:

Explorers—2-4 hours (group work) plus 4 hours (at-home work) = 6-8 hours total

Pioneers—3-4 hours (group work) plus 4 hours (at-home work) = 7-8 hours total

Patriots—3-6 hours (group work) plus 6-7 hours (at-home work) = 9-13 hours

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Every Meeting

The Heart of Womanhood Patch Program is based upon the Heart of Womanhood PORTRAITS digital book series. Each lesson in this series includes the following components, but only the portions marked (*) below are required to earn the patch:

- 1. Prepare Your Heart (25 minutes)—Coloring page and "Identity Words"
- 2. *Portrait Bible Study (30 minutes)—Lesson script to read and questions to discuss
- 3. Praise (5 minutes)—Hymn lyrics to read or sing
- 4. *Project (30 minutes)—Hands-on projects (usually crafty) to reinforce the lesson
- 5. Parent Chat (15 minutes)—Additional reading and discussion to complete with parent or mentor
- 6. Picture-Perfect Ending (5 minutes)—Prayer circle and verse recitation
- 7. *Personalized Heartwork (5 minutes, daily homework)—Brief time in Scripture each day
- 8. Sir-Prize (30 minutes, weekly homework)—An interactive extension of the lesson to enjoy with fathers

Since each Portrait Bible Study and Project is estimated to take only 20-30 minutes, a Unit could easily divide these requirements between Troop meetings. Explorers would require eight meetings to complete the Patch Program, nine meetings for Pioneers, and 15 meetings for Patriots. Since not all projects are required to earn the patch, Troops may choose their favorites from the available selections. At-home time would be necessary for all girls to complete their Personalized Heartwork.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Dedicated Meetings

If a Unit would prefer to dedicate full meetings to completing this study, 2-3 Bible studies or Projects could be completed at each meeting. At this pace, Explorers and Pioneers would need 2-3 dedicated meetings, and Patriots would need 3-5 meetings. At-home time would still be necessary for all girls to complete their Personalized Heartwork.

Faith-Focused Event

Explorers, Pioneers, and Patriots could complete the Patch Program requirements for the first book in a 3-4 hour, half-day event, leaving room for breaks and a meal. Patriots would need a more extended event or second event day to complete the second book. At-home time would still be necessary for all girls to complete their Personalized Heartwork.

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings by completing two Bible studies and one Project per day. Explorers and Pioneers would need three days, and Patriots would need five (or more dedicated time during a shorter number of days). At-home time would still be necessary for all girls to complete their Personalized Heartwork, or girls could complete this during daily quiet time in a weeklong camp setting.

Independent Study

A girl could easily complete the simplified Heart of Womanhood Patch Program requirements at home (parental mentorship is advised to facilitate discussion). However, families or small groups may wish to complete the book series as designed—a long-term Bible study to draw together younger women with mature female mentors by meeting regularly. The lessons are laid out in a weekly gathering format with

seven days of follow-up homework. When following the program as written, an estimated two hours are spent per lesson in Bible study, discussion, and activities, and an additional hour is spent on follow-up work during the week. Independent study would be necessary with this approach since the total time spent would be closer to 18 hours for Frame 1 and an additional 15 hours for Frame 2. If desired, a girl, family, or small group could complete the six-book series in 31 weeks (about one full school year), earning all six rockers to place around the Heart of Womanhood Patch. Homeschool families might consider the entire 31-week program to contribute toward their Bible credit for the school year.

Download and thoroughly read the Leader Guide and Lessons. The Leader Guide provides many helpful tips for leading this study with your daughter or a small group.

Projects

1-2 Projects are included in each lesson. Review these Projects to choose which you will complete with your Troop's girls.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedules).

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations.

I CHOOSE TRUTH PATCH PROGRAM

Today's girls face a number of challenges adults never dealt with at their age. From skyrocketing anxiety rates to bullying on social media, the Enemy's lies are everywhere. The I Choose Truth Patch Program is based on the books *Lies Girls Believe* and *Lies Young Women Believe* by Dannah Gresh of True Girl Ministry (coauthored with Nancy Demoss Wolgemuth). These books engage a girl in important Biblical truths so she can live the way God meant for her to live—free! With differing topics for younger and older girls, these books expose the lies most commonly believed by girls today—such as lies about God, friendship, the future, boys, and more—and counter them with God's truth. This study is available to all Program Levels.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn the B.Y. Faith Award and I Choose Truth Patch:

- 1. Tenderhearts and Explorers read *Lies Girls Believe & the Truth That Sets Them Free* (14 chapters, 167 pages) and respond to questions, either by writing in their book or through group discussion.
- 2. Pioneers and Patriots read *Lies Young Women Believe & the Truth That Sets Them* Free (15 chapters, 206 pages) and respond to questions, either by writing in their study guide or through group discussion.
- 3. All Program Levels complete one final craft to take with them as a reminder of all they have learned through this study, so girls may continue to apply these Biblical truths to their daily lives.

The total time required to complete this study depends upon Program Level, girl involvement in discussion, and how long they take to complete reading. The following is an estimated total time for completion of this study:

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Every Meeting

There are many ways to approach this Bible study, but AHG recommends presenting a minimal number of truths to girls at each meeting, giving them time to discuss the topic(s) together as a group and then time after the meeting to process internally and discuss with parents at home. The Sample Schedules shown below break down these truths between 18 weeks. If your Troop meets more frequently than every other week, you may wish to divide the schedule even further, so girls are presented with smaller truth nuggets to digest and process each time. There are a few differences for each Program Level to keep in mind:

Tenderhearts/Explorers—Lies Girls Believe includes questions and places for Tenderhearts and Explorers to write in answers workbook style. You will need to decide whether to purchase a book for each girl to write in or just one book for the Unit, which may be adapted by answering questions orally in group discussion, using a whiteboard for visuals (particularly helpful with early-reader Tenderhearts). In either case, plan for the Unit Leader to read aloud from the book each week. Troops may also purchase the on-demand video series to accompany their reading time. Younger girls will enjoy seeing all of the various animals author Dannah Gresh introduces to them on the screen. Consider the attention span of the girls in each Unit when deciding whether to add this optional supplemental material to your study time. It is also recommended, although not required, that Unit Leaders purchase A Mom's Guide to Lies Girls Believe & the Truth That Sets Them Free. This complement to Lies Girls Believe... provides research, cultural trends, and case studies about the problems tween girls face as well as encouragement and Biblical insight to support adults as they lead girls through this study.

Pioneers/Patriots—*Lies Young Women Believe* does not have a video series, but it does have an accompanying study guide. This study guide provides workbook-style questions and answer space, prompts for when to read the main book, and homework to digest the content. Consider the interests of the girls in each Unit when deciding whether to add this optional supplemental material to your study time. To save on meeting time, you may wish to have the girls read a chapter at home each week and conduct follow-up discussion time during meetings. The trade-off here is the need to buy a book for each girl. If you are conducting all your study work at Troop meetings, you may wish to purchase one study guide per girl to follow along as the Unit Leader reads from one copy of the main book. Know your girls and choose the best method for their needs, interests, and attention spans.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Dedicated Meetings

Since the bulk of this patch program involves reading, it may be challenging for girls to sit through listening to multiple chapters in one sitting. However, if the books are read at home, you may choose to have just two or three dedicated meetings to cover the discussion of the reading material and the additional activity at the end.

Faith-Focused Event

As with dedicated meetings, it would be challenging for girls to sit through listening to an entire book at a one-day event. This option may be wiser for older girls who have already read the material at home.

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings, dividing up chapters and activities between the number of days in the event. For a camp setting, independent book reading might be ideal for girls to spend quiet time during the day, returning to the group setting for discussion. Patriots could complete their whole book in five days with a chapter each morning, afternoon, and evening.

Independent Study

The I Choose Truth Patch Program lends itself well to independent study at home. Due to the topics raised, AHG recommends that girls work through the program with a parent to discuss what they have read and learned.

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to order, download, and print the items listed under "Materials Purchase" above. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study (or are close to finishing) before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities.

Permission Slip

The *Lies...* book series raises serious, real-world topics that are best addressed with parental input in a girl's personal identity, life choices, and developing Biblical Worldview. Print and distribute (or send by email) the I Choose Truth Patch Program Permission Slip to all Troop parents, which will provide them with an awareness of the subject matter being covered and prepare them for important conversations with their daughters. Consider distributing the permission slip early enough in your planning so that, if enough parents prefer to address these topics at home in the family setting, you can make plans for an alternative group Faith Award study instead of excluding just one or a few girls from Unit activities.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedules).

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations. For Tenderhearts and Explorers, if you plan to stream the videos, confirm that you have working internet access in your meeting space.

This study offers **Tenderhearts** and **Explorers** the opportunity to learn about the greatest journey of all—The Gospel. *The Greatest Journey* is a 12-lesson discipleship course designed for Operation Christmas Child shoebox recipients. Children who participate in the activities learn how to know Jesus, follow Him every day, and tell others this Good News. The *Student Workbook* is colorful and rich in both pictures and Scriptural content.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn the B.Y. Faith Award, girls must read and complete *The Greatest Journey Student Workbook* (96 pages). Each of the 12 lessons takes approximately 15-30 minutes to complete, depending upon the time required for discussion and written work. While there is not a patch specific to *The Greatest Journey*, Troops may choose to optionally purchase the Operation Christmas Child Patch to award girls for completing this study.

TOTAL TIME

The total time required to complete this study depends upon girl involvement in discussion and how long they take to complete the activities. The following is an estimated total time for completion of this study:

Tenderhearts-4-7 hours

Explorers—4-7 hours

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Every Meeting

The Greatest Journey is conveniently divided into chapters that can be distributed across multiple meeting dates. Each chapter contains a game, memory verse, read-aloud material, pictures, discussion questions, drawing activities, and a prayer. Since there are only 12 chapters, Troops who meet every week (versus every other week) could divide each chapter's contents between two meetings to take up less time during each meeting. Keep the workbooks at your meeting location (rather than sending them home with the girls) until the study is complete. Pull out the memory verse cards from the front of each workbook and give girls the corresponding memory verse card each week to take home. Girls may answer questions verbally in a group setting or draw picture representations—do not push early readers to write their answers if they are uncomfortable. The attendance chart is not required.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Dedicated Meetings

3-4 dedicated meetings would be needed to complete this study if a Troop chooses to conduct it in this format. Consider whether your Troop's girls would retain what they learned when hearing so much content in just one sitting.

Faith-Focused Event

Conducting this study as a one-day event is doable but not recommended for this age group. You may wish, however, to conduct the Welcome Lesson at an event early in the Program Year to introduce girls to what is to come.

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings. Divide up the chapters to correspond with the number of available days. To give girls time to digest and reflect upon the material discussed, consider dividing study time into multiple daily gatherings. For instance, if the event is four days long, you might complete one chapter each morning, one chapter each afternoon, and one chapter each evening, leaving room for meals and other activities.

Independent Study

The Greatest Journey is an excellent study for families to follow together at home. Parents should follow the Leader Guide in the same manner as a Unit Leader would during meetings.

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to order the items listed under "Materials Purchase" above. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study (or are close to finishing) before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedule).

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations.

B.Y. FAITH AWARDS

P.R.A.Y.





The Programs of Religious Activities with Youth (P.R.A.Y.) is a non-profit organization that fosters the Christian growth of children, youth, and families through their Bible-based religious emblems program for Protestant and Independent Christian churches. These programs offer girls the opportunity to grow in their faith through Bible Study, activities, and service.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS

To earn the B.Y. Faith Award and P.R.A.Y Patch:

- 1. Each Program Level completes the workbook appropriate for their age under the supervision of an assigned counselor (Troop Shepherd, Unit Leader, parent, etc.).
 - Tenderhearts—In *God and Me* (four lessons), girls will build a game box as they learn to become best friends with Jesus and tell their story of "God and Me" together.
 - Explorers—In *God and Family* (six sessions), girls will compare the different parts of the family to the different layers of a pizza as they discover God's plan for strong families.
 - Pioneers—In *God and Church* (three units), girls will take a "journey" to meet Jesus, worship God, and witness and minister for Christ.
 - Patriots—In *God and Life* (five sections), girls will learn how Christ calls them to serve by studying the life of the Apostle Paul as recorded in Acts 9:1-31.
- 2. Each girl presents her finished workbook to her pastor for final sign-off before ordering awards. This may be the pastor of the Charter Organization or the girl's home church.

TOTAL TIME

The total time required to complete this study depends upon Program Level, girl involvement in discussion, and how long they take to complete the activities. The following is an estimated total time for completion of this study:

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATION

Dedicated Meetings

Since the P.R.A.Y. lessons are conveniently broken into a few chapters ("Lessons," "Sessions," "Units," and "Sections"), AHG recommends presenting the material in dedicated meetings, each focused on a complete chapter. Since each Program Level has a differing number of lessons, not all Units would work on the P.R.A.Y. study on the same meeting nights (unless some chapters were merged or divided to line up with other Units). Following the "getting acquainted" activities from the front of the Counselor Manuals is unnecessary unless this is the beginning of the Program Year and it would help make connections between girls. Allow some questions to be answered orally in group discussions rather than expecting all written responses. Each Program Level's study has unique considerations to keep in mind:

TENDERHEARTS—God and Me instructs family participation for several activities, but girls could meet the same objectives by replacing family with "Troop" or "Unit." Younger girls may draw instead of writing their answers. You may wish to keep Tenderhearts' workbooks and GAMEboxes at the meeting location until the study is complete since they will continue using them each week.

EXPLORERS—Since the lessons in *God and Family* focus on family relationships, they contain activities that will need to be completed at home. You may wish to keep Explorers' workbooks and pizza boxes at the meeting location until the study is complete for girls to continue using them each week.

PIONEERS—*God and Church* involves learning a specific church's history, so this is best completed in Troops with church Charters and Troop Members from that church, OR each girl can research her own church as homework. Some projects are completed over time (e.g., daily Bible reading for three weeks), so meetings should be scheduled with those time frames in mind.

PATRIOTS—God and Life is primarily structured as reading, writing, and discussion plus five small projects. When the project is included, each chapter would extend longer than a regular meeting night. Patriots may wish to hold separate or longer meetings to complete this study, or projects could be extended into part of a meeting along with badgework, service projects, etc. Another option is for girls to complete their Bible reading and written answers at home and then come to the meeting prepared for group discussion and projects.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Every Meeting

Chapters may be divided into smaller portions that can be covered for a few minutes at every meeting if this best meets the Troop's needs. Pioneers and Patriots would still need additional days for their required outings.

Faith-Focused Event

Due to the time required for the study's activities, completing it at a one-day event is not recommended. If desired, though, a one-day event could focus on many portions of the study that would be enjoyable to complete in a group setting. The remaining portions could be completed at later meetings or independently, and Pioneers and Patriots could later go on their required outings.

P.R.A.Y. (continued)

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings, with each day focused on a complete chapter. As with a faith-focused event, however, follow-up work and field trips would still be necessary after the event.

Independent Study

With committed parental support, a girl can easily complete this study independently at home. Girls should bring their final projects and workbooks to show their Unit Leaders, obtaining their pastor's signature before or during meeting time.

HOW TO PREPARE

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to order the items listed under "Materials Purchase" above. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study (or are close to finishing) before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities.

Guest Speakers

Several activities involve interviews with or presentations from guest speakers. Confirm who is available to meet with the girls, schedule the appropriate dates on their calendar and yours, and send a list of interview questions before the meeting date, if applicable. Follow up with guest speakers the week before your meeting to confirm they are still coming.

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedules).

The AHG Catholic Faith Awards (CFAs) were created for Catholic American Heritage Girls to learn more about their faith and develop a stronger relationship with Christ in a fun and hands-on manner. The Catholic Faith Awards were designed for each of the AHG Program Levels to better understand the AHG Oath, Mission, and Creed.

The AHG National Catholic Committee (AHG NCC) developed the Catholic Faith Award Program to be worked on each year to better comprehend the fullness of the faith. Each award is divided into Segments one Segment for each year of the Program Level.

AWARD REQUIREMENTS



Deus et Familia Mea: God and My Family (three Tenderheart Segments)

Deus et Familia Mea guides Catholic Tenderhearts through an awareness of who they are as children of God in the family of the Catholic Church. Girls will learn about the Holy Mass, sacraments, traditions, and history of the Catholic Church with fun, hands-on activities. Tenderhearts are encouraged to explore and perform works of charity for their families and neighbors.



Deus et Patria Mea: God and My Country (three Explorer Segments)

Deus et Patria Mea allows Catholic Explorers to learn about various saints representing the United States of America. Explorers enrich their faith by exploring the Catholic elements that are most important to those saints, including the Eucharist, Corporal Works of Mercy, and missionary work. Deus et Patria Mea is thought-provoking, hands-on, and will foster a desire in Explorers to serve Jesus Christ through the Catholic Church.



Deus et Civitas Mea: God and My Community (two Pioneer Segments)

Deus et Civitas Mea guides Catholic Pioneers to examine service in their community through Sacred Scripture and Catholic Church Tradition. Girls learn the importance of preparing to serve through prayer and learning about people who exemplified service in their lives. Pioneers put what they have learned into practice by serving others and reflecting on their service's impact.



Femina Integritatis: Woman of Integrity (four Patriot Segments)

Femina Integritatis encourages Catholic Patriots to internalize and immerse themselves in being a Catholic Woman of Integrity. Prayer and discussion are essential elements of this study, with opportunities for outings and engaging speakers. By studying the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Our Blessed Mother, the lives of the saints, and the sacraments, Patriots discern God's call for their lives after high school.

TOTAL TIME

The total time required to complete one Segment of this study depends upon Program Level, girl involvement in discussion, and how long they take to complete the activities. The following are estimates by Program Level for a single Segment:

Tenderhearts—2-4 hours (workbook) plus 3-6 hours (at home) = 5-10 hours total

Explorers—3-5 hours (workbook) plus 3-7 hours (at home) = 6-12 hours total

Pioneers—7-14 hours (workbook and trips) plus 2-3 hours (at home) = 9-17 hours total

Patriots—9-13 hours (workbook and trips) plus 6-9 hours (at home) = 15-22 hours total

CATHOLIC FAITH AWARD INSIGNIA

A girl will earn a patch for each Segment she completes. In the final year of a Program Level, a girl who has completed all Segments in that Program Level may earn a medal. One exception is the Patriot book Femina Integritatis: Woman of Integrity. Patriots may earn a patch for each Segment completed, the Moral Compass medal for completing Segments One and Two, and the Quiver of Arrows medal for completing Segments Three and Four.

Girls wear segment patches on the back and medals on the front of vests and sashes. Tenderhearts and Explorers wear the medals under the Troop numbers on their vest. Pioneers and Patriots wear the medals under the Flag Patch on their sash.

Girls may transfer these medals to new uniforms as they advance in Program Level in order to display the

RECOMMENDED IMPLEMENTATIONS

Independent Study

The AHG Catholic Faith Awards (CFAs) for Tenderhearts and Explorers were designed to be completed at home under the guidance and involvement of a parent. Only one Segment is completed each Program Year at a pace and schedule that works best for the family.

NOTE: If your Troop's parents prefer to lead their daughters through completion of the CFAs in a group setting, AHG recommends implementing this Faith Award with four dedicated meetings (as described below for Pioneers and Patriots). Set-up for dedicated meetings with Tenderhearts and Explorers should include space for each parent to sit with their daughter.* Each parent owns the leadership of guiding their daughter through the material and may seek input from an approved, trained CFA Mentor as questions arise. A parent may also elect to allow the CFA Mentor to lead some portions of the requirements (i.e., how to assemble a rosary) as the parent works alongside their daughter to complete the activity together. Even if the Troop has chosen to provide a group setting for award completion, a parent may still opt for their daughter to complete her CFA at home. Regardless of whether a Troop provides dedicated Faith Award meetings, some requirements will involve at-home work and cannot be completed in a group setting. Most at-home requirements are already a part of practicing Catholic families' day-to-day lives, such as prayer, Mass, and serving family members—the workbook merely provides education, direction, and follow-up discussion for these activities.

Dedicated Meetings

The AHG CFAs for Pioneers and Patriots are designed to be completed in a group setting under the guidance and involvement of an approved CFA Mentor. This mentor must be an Adult Member and complete the **Catholic Faith Award Mentor Training** in AHGfamily (under the **AHGequip** tab). Each Segment of the CFAs is divided into four chapters, allowing convenient division of material between four dedicated meetings. Dedicated meetings may be regular Troop meeting nights that are exclusively devoted to Faith Award activities, or they may be meetings on an alternate day of the week, such as four Saturday mornings. Pioneers and Patriots also require some at-home work and group field trips that challenge them to put their faith into action.

One consideration for walking through this study in a group setting is the need to present each Segment to girls in the appropriately corresponding year at that Program Level. AHG suggests first conducting meetings to cover Segment 1 (for all girls who have not yet completed that Segment), then first-year girls drop out as the group continues on to Segment 2 (for all girls who have not yet completed that Segment), then second-year girls drop out as the group continues on to Segment 3, and so forth. This would provide a "catch-up" opportunity for Troops who are completing CFAs for the first time or girls who are new to AHG and entered towards the middle or end of their Program Level. Another approach might be to divide girls into small groups based on workbook Segments. For example, Pioneers could be divided into two smaller groups: first-year Pioneers and second-year Pioneers. At least one approved, Adult Member with CFA Mentor training should lead the group. Additional support, such as a Unit Leader with each Pioneer and Patriot small group, may be provided, as long as the lead CFA Mentor communicates important information from their training to the assisting adults.

NOTE: With committed parental support, Pioneers and Patriots may complete the AHG CFAs independently at home (as described above for Tenderhearts and Explorers). Pioneers and Patriots would need their parents' involvement to engage in discussion, review their workbook and journal entries, and assist in taking them on required outings.

ALTERNATIVE IMPLEMENTATIONS

Every Meeting

Chapters may be divided into smaller portions that can be covered for a few minutes at every regular Troop meeting if this best meets the Troop's needs. The challenge would be soliciting Tenderheart and Explorer parent involvement for those few minutes at every meeting.* Pioneers and Patriots would need additional days for their required outings.

Faith-Focused Event

At-home and field trip requirements necessitate follow-up work beyond one day spent in workbook activities. If desired, though, a one-day event could focus on many portions of the study that would be enjoyable to complete in a group setting. Parents would need to join to lead their Tenderheart and Explorer daughters.* Clear and regular communication would be needed after that date to confirm each girl has independently completed the remaining portions of the study.

Multi-Day Event

A multi-day event could be approached similarly to dedicated meetings, especially if the event is at least four days long. As with a faith-focused event, however, follow-up at-home work and field trips would still be necessary to complete all the requirements after the event. Parents would also need to join to lead their Tenderheart and Explorer daughters.*

* Please keep in mind that whenever Tenderheart and Explorer parents attend a group meeting or event to complete the CFAs, they are present to lead only their own daughter, and they cannot be counted in Adult Member to Girl Member ratios unless they are registered members of AHG. Also, consult your Charter Organization on this approach, as some require all adults in attendance to take diocesan youth protection training.



HOW TO PREPARE

The following steps will help you effectively prepare to guide girls through this study:

Program Materials

Your first step will be to order the items listed under "Materials Purchase" above. This will enable you to preview the study and reference it frequently as you plan. Wait until girls have completed the study before ordering insignia to confirm more accurate quantities.

Training

The adult volunteer leading girls through this study must complete the **Catholic Faith Award Mentor Training** in AHGfamily (under the AHGequip tab). This is an important step for all adults assisting with the CFAs, and is therefore also recommended for the parents.

Parents

Prepare Tenderheart and Explorer parents to lead their girls through the completion of this study through training and support. An optional alternative to the Catholic Faith Award Mentor Training for parents would be for the Troop's CFA Mentor (i.e., Troop Shepherd) to present key points from that training to the parents. This could be done one-on-one or in a group meeting with the parents at the start of the year. Provide for parents an overview of the CFA workbooks, the Troop's proposed timeline for completion, and the CFA Mentor's contact information as a line of support for any questions that may arise.

Guest Speakers

Several activities involve interviews with or presentations from guest speakers. Confirm who is available to meet with the girls, schedule the appropriate dates on their calendar and yours, and send a list of interview questions before the meeting date, if applicable. Follow up with guest speakers the week before your meeting to confirm they are still coming.



Encyclicals

Review all encyclicals before presenting them to girls to determine which portions to highlight. The intention is to expose girls to these teachings rather than train them as experts. Reading a few paragraphs aloud together and then discussing (i.e., what they mean, how they are used, etc.) meets that goal. Girls with a prior introduction to encyclicals may be challenged to dive deeper in discussion, but never to the point of extending longer than a typical meeting time.

Schedule

Create a schedule for completion and determine who is responsible for leading each part and what additional supplies are needed (see Sample Schedules). Pioneers and Patriots may use this as a leadership opportunity by assisting with scheduling, contacting guest speakers, coordinating plans for outings, etc.

NOTE: Keep in mind that activities, service projects, guest speakers, etc. may be completed concurrently and "out-of-order" with flexibility to meet the needs of the Troop. Also consider whether existing activities and events on the Troop calendar might apply toward specific CFA requirements. For example, if a Troop conducts a food drive for AHG's National Day of Service in September, this would still apply towards the second-year Explorers' service project in Segment 2, Chapter 4, even if the rest of that chapter is not completed until later in the Program Year.

Supplies

Conclude your preparations by gathering any remaining supplies listed in your schedule. This is in addition to the materials already purchased at the beginning of your preparations. Several documents referenced in the CFAs may be found with a keyword search on the **official Vatican website** and printed as needed.

The general questions within this section of the Faith Award Program F.A.Q. apply to all Faith Award Studies within the Faith Award Program.

Why does the award insignia link not bring me to the correct ordering site?

Only specific roles may order certain awards. Archdiocesan or diocesan authorized purchaser(s) may order Catholic Faith Award medals and patches. **Troop's authorized purchaser(s)** (such as Troop Coordinators, Troop Treasurers, or Troop Advancement Chairs) may order Catholic Faith Award patches, B.Y. Faith Award pins, and badges. Any other Troop role will not have access to these purchasing sites but still may order the optional B.Y. Faith Award patches.

Can girls still complete programs previously listed in the Religious Recognitions Guide?

As of the 2022-2023 Program Year, only the approved Faith Awards listed above may count toward the Level Awards requirement for Faith Award programming.

Several girls in my Troop have insignia for a faith-based study not listed here. Can other girls earn these awards?

Any awards not included on the currently approved Faith Award listing are no longer accepted as meeting the Level Awards requirement for Faith Award programming. Any faith-focused awards earned prior to changes in the approved listing may still be displayed on girls' uniforms, even if they cannot continue to be earned by other girls.

What programs fulfill the Abigail Adams Award requirement for Faith Award programming?

Any study option listed above for Patriots fulfills the Abigail Adams Award requirement for Faith Award programming. Patriots who have completed one of the options listed in the *Religious Recognitions Guide* in their Patriot years before June 2021 may count this for their Abigail Adams Award requirement. This includes P.R.A.Y.: God and Life, NFCYM: Marian (Mary, the First Disciple) or Spirit Alive, MCCS: Giving Servant, EOCS: Alpha Omega, and the AHG Spiritual Development Badge.

What programs fulfill the National Honor Troop Award requirement for the Faith Objective?

As of the 2021-2022 Program Year, AHG only accepts study options from the listing above for the National Honor Troop Award Faith Objective requirement.

Are girls required to earn AHG Faith Awards?

Tenderheart, Explorer, Pioneer, and Patriot girls who are pursuing their Level Awards are required to earn a Faith Award. These programs serve as an excellent tool for learning more about the Lord and growing closer to Him. Faith components weave throughout the AHG Program, but the Faith Awards allow for in-depth studies, community time, and spiritual growth. AHG Faith Awards are forward-focusing, allowing girls to build on their faith over time as they progress through AHG. Patriots earning the Catholic Faith Award must complete Segments One and Two. Patriots earning the B.Y. Faith Award must complete one year of Faith Award programming.

Can Pathfinders earn Faith Awards?

As an introduction to the full AHG Program, the Pathfinder Program integrates many faith elements throughout the various activities. Pathfinders do not earn Faith Awards.

Can a girl complete Faith Award requirements from a different Program Level as part of her Individualized Achievement Plan (IAP)?

A girl should only complete Faith Award requirements designated for her Program Level. There may be extenuating circumstances where a girl has an IAP and adjustments are necessary within her Program Level. For example, instead of completing a written answer to a question she may verbally convey what she has learned. The girl's IAP Care Team makes any final decisions regarding adjustments to Faith Award requirements.

How can Faith Awards be included if our Troop has girls in multiple denominations?

There are several options for Troops with girls of multiple denominations. It is important to be flexible and always include parents when making decisions that will impact a girl's faith life. Troops may encounter differing points of view among the girls through Faith Awards, particularly with membership from multiple Christian faith traditions and backgrounds. This is an excellent opportunity for girls to learn to demonstrate respect towards each other. Troops serving girls from multiple faith traditions should assist girls and families in selecting a Faith Award that honors what the family teaches at home. Families can lean into the wisdom of their priest or pastor in both selecting curriculum and continuing in-depth discussions of deeper topics raised during girl studies. A few options for Troops with multiple denominations include:

- · Girls can complete Faith Awards individually with the guidance of a parent or mentor.
- Girls can gather in groups based on denomination.
- Girls from multiple Troops can gather based on denomination.
- · Girls from multiple faith traditions can complete an ecumenical Faith Award Program together.

Is a girl allowed to participate in a Faith Award Program that does not fit her church's denomination?

Troops and girls may pursue any of the approved Faith Award options as long as the faith traditions of each family and the Charter Organization are respected at all times. See the above question and answer for Troops with girls in multiple denominations.

Is a girl practicing a religious tradition outside of the Christian faith allowed to participate in the Faith Award Program?

Before the girl works on her Faith Award, her parents or guardians, the leader of her place of worship, and the Charter Organization should agree to allow the girl to participate.

Is a girl who is not practicing any religious tradition allowed to participate in the Faith Award Program? Before the girl works on her Faith Award, her parents or guardians and the Charter Organization should agree to allow the girl to participate.

Can a girl earn multiple Faith Awards at her Program Level?

Faith is built into many aspects of the AHG Program and is not confined to the Faith Award Program. Throughout their time in AHG, girls should experience the full range of programming, which is why AHG only requires one Faith Award per Program Level for Level Awards. If a girl following the Catholic Faith Award Program wishes to complete each year's segment, or a girl wishes to pursue a new B.Y. Faith Award each year, this is acceptable as long as it does not pull away from other programming activities. (Please note that a girl can potentially earn a patch annually for each Faith Award, but she can only earn one to two Catholic Faith Award Medals and one B.Y. Faith Award Pin per Program Level.) Girls and Troop leadership may wish to review their annual plans together to ensure that a girl enjoys a well-rounded experience with faith, service, and fun!

What happens if a girl joins AHG later in her Program level or partway through the year and misses the opportunity to complete her Faith Award with her Unit?

Every girl should be offered the opportunity to complete her Faith Award, as it is required in earning her Level Award. If a girl misses the opportunity, her parents or guardians should be informed about what is available. Girls are allowed to work on many aspects of the program individually and can participate at their own pace if they desire. Each girl has a unique AHG journey and is permitted to opt out of Faith Awards and Level Awards.

How should parents be involved in the Faith Award Program?

No matter what level of involvement a parent has in the Troop, parents should be informed of what their girls are learning, especially with matters of faith. Be sure to communicate clearly and regularly with the parents what their daughter will be learning. A partnership of learning will serve as intentional reinforcement of the principles included in the Faith Award Program.

The questions within this section of the Faith Award Program F.A.Q. are in reference to a girl's completion of a B.Y. Faith Award as her Faith Award of choice.

What is new to the B.Y. Faith Award Program in 2022-2023?

AHG expanded the above listing of study options to include several AHG faith-focused badges.

Are there any additional changes or updates to the B.Y. Faith Award Program in 2022-2023?

For the 2022-2023 Program Year, AHG is introducing the supplementary R.E.A.L. Life Creed Study Extension Pack which provides study pages for all "dig deeper" passages.

AHG has also designed a Live It Out Patch for the girls to earn upon completion of the Live It Out study.

Does a girl have to continue with the same study in subsequent Program Levels

No, a girl may pursue the same B.Y. Faith Award at each available Program Level, or she may choose different programs at each Program Level.

Is a girl required to complete the B.Y. Faith Awards with Unit Leaders?

No, she is not. A girl may work on her B.Y. Faith Award at home or church. She will need to share her work and experience with her Troop Shepherd or Unit Leader to verify she has completed the requirements.

Does a girl need both the B.Y. Faith Award Pin and the patch?

No, she does not. The B.Y. Faith Award Pins are the required insignia for B.Y. Faith Awards. While some studies offer a patch, this patch is optional. Unit Leaders may choose to only purchase the pin for the girls and not the patch.

Why do the pins move to the next Program Level, but the patches do not?

The B.Y. Faith Award Pins are the primary insignia for the B.Y. Faith Award Program. Through earning her B.Y. Faith Award, a girl may complete a patch at her Program Level. The patch represents how the girl earned her B.Y. Faith Award and is optional. Girls may move pins to the next Program Level to show the program's forward-focusing progression and encourage girls to build on what they have learned.

Because the pins move up to the next Program Level's Uniform, can I purchase pins from previous Levels for a girl if she completed her Religious Recognition in that Level?

Yes, you may, but this is not required.

Who is allowed to order insignia?

The Troop orders a girl's B.Y. Faith Award insignia.

Where do I go if I have additional questions?

CATHOLIC FAITH AWARDS (CFAs)

The questions within this section of the Faith Award Program F.A.Q. are in reference to a girl's completion of a Catholic Faith Award as her Faith Award of choice.

CATHOLIC FAITH AWARDS (CFA)

Do girls need a specific person to work on the CFAs?

For Tenderhearts and Explorers, the girls should work with their parents. Pioneers and Patriots should work with a mentor who has taken the AHG Catholic Faith Award Mentor Training available in **AHGequip**.

Who should be my girl's mentor?

A Catholic Faith Award Mentor should be a well-formed Catholic such as the Troop Shepherd, an adult who has had catechesis training, the parish director of religious education, or a religious sister, brother, or priest. The mentor should always have two-deep leadership.

Can girls work with girls from other Troops or dioceses?

Deus et Civitas Mea: God and My Community and Femina Integritatis: Woman of Integrity both work best in a group setting. For Troops with only one Pioneer or Patriot, AHG encourages the formation of a group with girls from other AHG Troops to earn their Catholic Faith Awards together. Troops are highly discouraged from joining a group outside of their diocesan boundary. If there are no Catholic girls within the diocesan boundary, please contact the AHG National Catholic Committee for additional help at catholiccommittee@ahgncc.org.

Do girls need to complete all activities, service projects, and outings?

Yes, girls should complete all of these. If a requirement is particularly challenging in your area, please consult with your diocesan authorized purchaser(s) to ask about modification.

If a girl joins AHG in the second or third year of a Program Level, where should she start?

Catholic girls can start with Segment One of their Program Level's CFA or the Segment corresponding to their year within that Program Level. For example, if a girl joins AHG in the 5th grade, she may begin with Segment Two of Deus et Patria Mea: God and My Country. She may also complete Segment One, but she cannot jump ahead to Segment Three until she advances as a third-year Explorer. Patriots should always start with Segment One of Femina Integritatis: Woman of Integrity.

Can a girl work on Segments outside of her Program Level (i.e., can an Explorer go back and work on a Tenderheart Faith Award)?

No, a girl should only work on Segments within her Program Level. She should not move ahead or work on previous Program Levels' segments.

How do Catholic girls satisfy the Faith Award requirement for each Level Award?

Tenderhearts, Explorers, and Pioneers are each required to complete one Segment of their Program Level's Catholic Faith Award. Patriots must complete Segments One and Two of Femina Integritatis: Woman of Integrity to earn their Abigail Adams Level Award.

If a girl has already earned her NFCYM award during her current Program Level, could she still work on the Catholic Faith Awards for the remainder of her Program Level?

Yes, absolutely! Any girl may work on a Catholic Faith Award even if she already has earned an NFCYM award.

If a girl has already earned her Spirit Alive or Marian Medals as a first-year Patriot, can she count this toward the Abigail Adams Level Award requirement?

Yes, if a girl has earned Spirit Alive or the Marian Medal as a Patriot before the release of the Catholic Faith Award Program on June 1, 2020, she may count it toward the Abigail Adams Level Award.

How are the patches and medals presented to the girls?

Ask your diocesan authorized purchaser(s) if they conduct a special award ceremony for youth earning religious awards. Some dioceses have an annual "Scout Mass," typically held between January and May. Dioceses usually only award the medal. Troops or churches should award patches at a special ceremony, such as a Court of Awards or Holy Mass, at the discretion of the parish priest.

Can a Catholic girl earn a B.Y. Faith Award to count toward her Level Award requirement?

AHG is committed to girls growing in their faith and values the role of the Charter Organization and a girl's home church in her faith formation. For this reason, AHG does not dictate which Faith Award a girl needs to earn. While AHG recommends the Catholic Faith Awards (CFAs) as the Faith Award option for girls of the Catholic faith, it leaves the final determination up to the girl's priest and family. If it is deemed most appropriate by her parents and the pastor of her parish. Catholic girls are permitted to complete a B.Y. Faith Award in lieu of a CFA. Curriculum should be made available for both the pastor and parents to review when discerning which Faith Award option is the best fit to encourage the faith walk of a girl.
